
Showcase news: We have some new shirts, glasses and other signature items in the showcase - stock up for summer before they're gone.

Everyday could be a Taco Tuesday...Who doesn't love a tacos:

They are *Super fast, Super easy, Fresh and crispy, Full of flavor and fun. Tacos are a favorite back-pocket weeknight meal!*

Vegan: BBQ Jackfruit & black bean tacos with seared pineapple topping!

1. Rinse can Jackfruit and shred.
2. Season evenly with garlic powder, onion powder, smoked paprika, & thyme. Add dashes of cayenne pepper, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt & lime juice.
3. Mix and refrigerate for 2 hours.
4. Spread evenly on cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 20 min. Toss it and bake for another 10 min. Broil on low for 3 min until crispy. Lightly apply BBQ sauce and toss.
5. Mix black beans with salsa.
6. Sear pineapple.
7. Serve layered with a toasted flour shell. Add freshly chopped onion & lettuce.

Fish Tacos:

Ingredients: 3 tablespoons butter, melted, juice of 1 lime, 1 teaspoon chili powder, 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder, pinch of salt, 10-15 oz. cod or other white fish, thawed, tortillas and avocados for serving and Slaw for serving (see notes)

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Mix butter, lime juice, chili powder, garlic powder, and salt in a small bowl. Pour mixture over the fish. Bake for 10-15 minutes.
2. Flake apart the fish and coat with the extra sauce in the pan.
3. Make your dressing and pour it on the cabbage.
Slaw dressing: Make a sauce by blending in a food processor 1/4 cup oil, 1/4 cup water, 1/2 cup chopped green onions, 1/2 cup cilantro, 1-2 cloves garlic, juice of 2 limes, 1/2 cup sour cream or Greek yogurt, and a pinch of salt. Pour sauce over shredded cabbage to make a slaw!
4. Prep your toppings (mashed avocado, slaw, red onion, mango salsa, whatever you like). Serve fish in tortillas with toppings!



Stay Safe on the Water this Summer with these Helpful Boat Safety Tips:

Emergencies are just that... unexpected events that you don't know are about to happen. What you can know is how to be as prepared as possible. The first step in preparing for an emergency is having a basic kit ready to go. Here are a few basic items that all boaters should have:

Flashlight - A flashlight and extra batteries can help you see around your boat in the dark and allow you to be seen if you run out of fuel or if your craft stalls.

Duct Tape - It's true... it's one of the most useful things you can have. Even a minor leak can be repaired with duct tape.

Bailing Bucket- Sometimes you just need to bail. If you do, a simple bucket can make all the difference.

First Aid Kit - A properly equipped first aid kit, plus the knowledge on how to use it, is vital in case of an accident or medical emergency.

Good Knife- You never know when you need to cut a line free from a prop.

Whistle - As a recognized signal calling for help on the water, a waterproof whistle is another must-have item.

Ropes and Dock Lines- Having a sturdy rope and dock lines are critical. If you ever need to be towed or lash something, having a rope and/or dock line can be a lifesaver.

Fire Extinguisher - Just because you're on the water doesn't mean you can't have an on-board fire. All passengers should know the location of your fire extinguisher and how to use it.




A few safety reminders that can certainly help protect us: (To put some positive thoughts toward the upcoming boating season I thought it would be beneficial to reissue some safety advice from a past article from Former Fleet Captain Ryan Miller)

1. Be sure to inspect your electrical connections and systems to ensure everything is tight and corrosion-free. No one should get into the water in any marina.
2. Consider installing or checking a number of safety detection devices that can save your boat, or more importantly you. Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in the sleeping areas have been written about recently and are always a good idea. High-bilge-water and gasoline vapor detectors down in the engine compartment.
3. If you're a member of Boat US, download the Boat US app on your phone to get instant access to your services, weather forecasts/advisories, and request a tow.
4. Another useful app is from the US Coast Guard. Safety equipment checklists, requesting a Safety Check, filing a float plan, brushing up on the "Rules of the Road", reporting a hazard, etc. You can also populate a profile with your boat and contact information. In case of an emergency there is a one touch call button that shares your location and information.
5. For those that were able to attend the "Suddenly in Command" class last year, I'm sure you would agree that educating your guests about the basics of your boat is always a good idea. Most times we're in a hurry to get moving, excited to get the trip started, or just don't think anything will happen. Taking the few minutes to make sure people know where life jackets, fire extinguishers, throwables, etc. are at could prove life saving.
