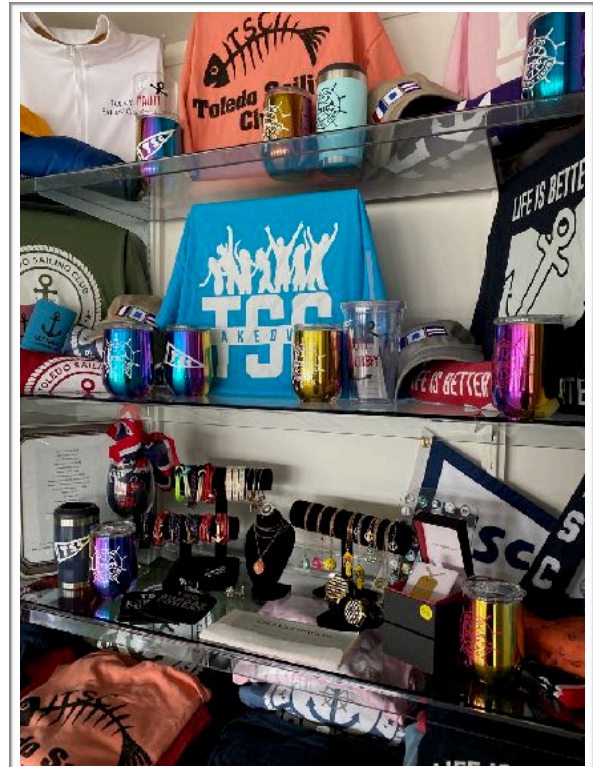

Cherry Blackberry Mojito

Beautiful and filled with flavor, this blackberry mojito recipe with cherries is perfect for parties or just a cocktail at home alone

Ingredients:

3 cherries stems removed and pitted, 3 blackberries, 10 mint leaves, 2 oz Bacardi White Rum, 2 oz simple syrup, 1 cup ice crushed, 1/2 cup club soda and 1 lime- lime juice from 1 lime per drink

Garnish Ingredients:

1 lime sliced, mint leaves, 1 fresh cherry and 1 fresh blackberry

Instructions:

Homemade Simple Syrup Directions (Optional)

To make simple syrup, combine 1 cup sugar and 1 cup water and bring it to a boil. Stir to let sugar dissolve and remove from heat. Let syrup cool.

Cherry Blackberry Mojito Directions

Use a 12 to 16 oz firm glass, combine cherries and blackberries, mint leaves, white rum and simple syrup. Muddle the ingredients to extract the juices from the mint leaves and fruit. Add lime juice from one lime, ice and soda water to fill the glass. Garnish with lime, mint, and fruit.

2. Crossing: Give right of way to boats ahead and to the right of you (**see DANGER ZONE**)
3. Passing: Give right of way **KEEP CLEAR**

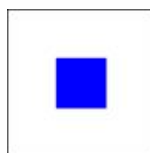
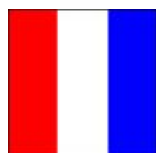

ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS WEEKLY GREAT LAKES WATER LEVEL UPDATE					
Jun 19, 2020					
WEATHER CONDITIONS					
<p>In general, temperatures in the Great Lakes basin have gotten progressively warmer this week. Slightly cooler temperatures will be seen in northwestern portions of the basin this upcoming weekend as a cold front will impact this area bringing showers and thunderstorms. Overall, it has been pretty dry the past week with just some light precipitation. Temperature wise this upcoming week is predicted to be similar to last week, with temperatures sticking slightly above or near their historic averages throughout the week. As for rain and thunderstorms, there is a large storm system moving into the Great Lakes basin and rain showers are predicted from Sunday into mid next week.</p>					
LAKE LEVEL CONDITIONS					
<p>Lake Superior's June 19th forecasted level is 6 inches lower than it was a year ago, while the June 19th forecasted levels for Lakes Michigan-Huron and St. Clair are 4 and 1 inches, respectively higher than last year's levels. Lakes Erie and Ontario's predicted levels for June 19th are 3 and 24 inches, respectively below what it was at this time last year. The projected June 19th levels for Lakes Michigan-Huron and St. Clair are 4 and 2 inches, respectively above their highest monthly average level for June. Lake Superior is predicted to be 2 inches, respectively higher than its June 19th projected level by July 19th. A month from now, the water level for Lake Michigan-Huron is expected to be near its June 19th level and Lake St. Clair is predicted to decrease below its June 19th level by 2 inches. Lakes Erie and Ontario are forecast to be 2 and 3 inches, respectively below their June 19th expected level by July 19th. See our Daily Levels web page for more water level information.</p>					
FORECASTED MONTHLY OUTFLOWS/CHANNEL CONDITIONS					
<p>Lake Superior's outflow into the St. Marys River is forecasted to be above average this month. Lake Michigan-Huron's outflow into the St. Clair River and Lake St. Clair's outflow through the Detroit River are predicted to be above average for June. In addition, Lake Erie's outflow into the Niagara River and Lake Ontario's outflow into the St. Lawrence River are projected to be above average for June.</p>					
ALERTS					
<p>Water levels shown are still-water surface elevations over the entire lake surface. Water levels at specific locations may differ substantially due to meteorological influences. Official records are based on monthly average water levels and not daily water levels. Users of the Great Lakes, connecting channels and St. Lawrence River should keep informed of current conditions before undertaking any activities that could be affected by changing water levels. Mariners should utilize navigation charts and refer to current water level readings. High water levels and potentially record high water levels are expected to persist for at least the next six months, so flood prone areas are expected to remain vulnerable. Ice information can be found at the National Ice Center's website.</p>
