### Showcase news:

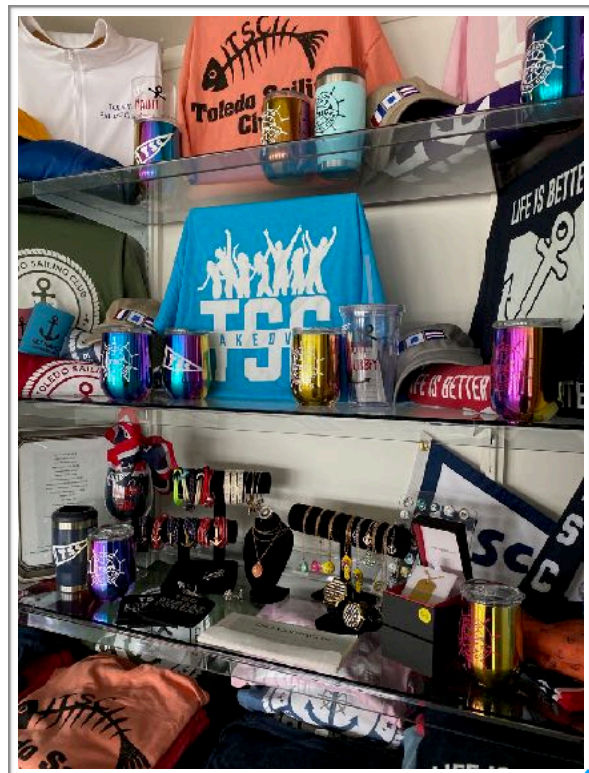

## **Strawberry-Lemonade Punch**

This sweetly refreshing berry punch is kid-friendly, from the star-shaped fruit, to the non-alcoholic base. **You can also adult it up with a little rum or vodka.**

### **Ingredients:**

- 1 c. fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 c. pure maple syrup or agave
- 1 1/2 strawberries, hulled and halved
- 1 c. sparkling water
- 1 c. blueberries (optional)

### **Garnish:**

Cut slices of watermelon or honeydew into star shapes with a star-shaped cookie cutter. Use to adorn glasses.

### **Instructions:**

Combine lemon juice, maple syrup, 3/4 pound strawberries, and 2 cups water in a blender. Blend until smooth, 1 to 2 minutes. Combine sparkling water, lemon juice mixture, remaining 3/4 pound strawberries, and, if desired, blueberries in a pitcher. Serve topped with ice.

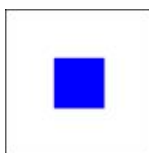
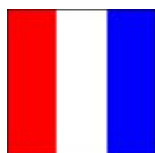
ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS WEEKLY GREAT LAKES WATER LEVEL UPDATE					
Jul 17, 2020					
WEATHER CONDITIONS					
Over the last week the Great Lakes region received above average precipitation. Each Lake saw precipitation throughout this observation period. Lake Superior received 0.01 to 3.0 inches, whereas Lake Huron, Lake Erie and Lake Ontario saw greater levels of precipitation ranging between 0.1 and 4.0 inches. Lake Michigan saw the most intense precipitation, as much as 6.0 inches, with most of the basin seeing greater than 1.0 inch. More precipitation is expected throughout the next week, with severe thunderstorms and heavy rainfall predicted to occur in the western portion of the basin within the next three days. Saturday through Wednesday saw temperatures which were milder than the previous week; however, temperatures remained above seasonal averages. Forecasts for July 17 through July 24 predict temperatures throughout the region to remain above average.					
LAKE LEVEL CONDITIONS					
The July 17 <sup>th</sup> projected level of Lake Superior is 4 inches lower than a year ago, while Lake Michigan-Huron's estimated level is 3 inches above last year's level. Lake Ontario's projected level matches its level of a year ago, whereas Lake Erie's and Ontario's predicted July 17 <sup>th</sup> levels are 2 and 24 inches, respectively, below last year's levels. Compared to June 17 <sup>th</sup> 2020, lake levels have remained steady, with Lake Ontario again being the sole outlier, experiencing a drop of 4 inches over the previous month. Michigan-Huron and St. Clair continue to hover near record monthly highs. Lake levels throughout the basin are expected to fall over the next month, with the exception of Lake Superior which is expected to increase by 1 inch. Lakes Michigan-Huron, St. Clair, Erie and Ontario are expected to fall 1, 3, 4 and 6 inches respectively. See our <a href="#">Daily Levels</a> web page for more water level information.					
FORECASTED MONTHLY OUTFLOWS/CHANNEL CONDITIONS					
Lake Superior's outflow into the St. Mary's River and Lake Michigan-Huron's outflow into the St. Clair River are predicted to be above average in July. Lake St. Clair's outflow through the Detroit River and Lake Erie's outflow into the Niagara River are forecasted to be above average in July. Moreover, the outflow of Lake Ontario into the St. Lawrence River are projected to be above average for July.					
ALERTS					
Water levels shown are still-water surface elevations over the entire lake surface. Water levels at specific locations may differ substantially due to meteorological influences. Official records are based on monthly average water levels and not daily water levels. Users of the Great Lakes, connecting channels and St. Lawrence River should keep informed of current conditions before undertaking any activities that could be affected by changing water levels. Mariners should utilize navigation charts and refer to current water level readings. High water levels and potentially record high water levels are expected to persist for at least the next six months, so flood prone areas are expected to remain vulnerable.
